Dear church family,

Baylus Benjamin McKinney was at the top of his career when he traveled to the Alabama Sunday School Convention in January 1936. The year before, the Heflin, Louisiana native became editor for the Baptist Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention.

At the convention, the author of such hymns as *The* Nail Scarred Hand, Speak to My Heart, Let Others See Jesus in You, and Satisfied with Jesus, met with his good friend of many years R. S. Jones. Mr. Jones had been a missionary in Brazil. As the two men visited and caught up over dinner, Mr. Iones revealed that his doctors would not allow him to return to South America due to his recent ill health.

"What will you do?" McKinney asked his friend. "I don't know, but wherever He leads I'll go," the missionary answered in earnest.

McKinney was unable to get his friend's words out of his mind. Before the convention session that evening, the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary alumni and faculty member, had expanded his friend's words to write both the lyrics and melody to the hymn, Wherever He Leads I'll Go.

On Sunday, September 7, 1952, Mr. McKinney had just left a conference in Ridgecrest, NC and was headed for another engagement in Gatlinburg, TN. While near Bryson City, NC, McKinney was killed in a car accident. In addition to his wife, two sons, and several brothers, he left behind a legacy that included numerous hymns.

His hometown of Heflin holds an annual McKinney song service each July to celebrate his 149 hymns and gospel songs.

Listen for Jesus

My mom has the lovely talent of being able to whistle louder than anyone I have ever encountered. She can do the whistle where she puts two fingers in her mouth and it makes the loudest noise. So loud that your ears ring if you're near her. If we were ever outside playing and she needed to call us back to her, she would first call our names. However, if we didn't come back or respond she would send out that whistle sound. And oh boy, no matter how far we were from her, we would hear her whistle. And when we heard it... we knew that we better run to wherever the noise came from because mom meant business. You see if my mom reached the point of having to whistle at us, that meant that we either heard her voice calling us and chose to ignore it (not a very wise decision), or we were just too far away from her for her voice to reach us and she had no other option but to whistle.

I think often times it's the same way with hearing the Lord's voice. You see when we spend constant time with him, when we retreat from the distractions of the world and spend still quiet time with him, we are able to hear his voice. He doesn't have to yell in order to call us to him. But when we are far from him, or when we ignore his voice in our life he has to make a loud whistle. And if it reaches the point that he has to make that loud whistle... in the same way that my mom meant business...he does too. However, if we're spending constant time with him if we're drawing near to him, he doesn't have to speak loudly because we are close to him. We are walking beside him. He doesn't have to yell to get his message across.

When we are close to him, his voice gets to be sweet and gentle. When we are close to him, we get the joy of experiencing his peace and his tenderness. In this season of lent, practice drawing near to him. Practice listening to his voice. Retreat from the distractions of this world, re-orient your life towards him, spend intentional time with him. Listen for his voice in your life. He deserves it.
